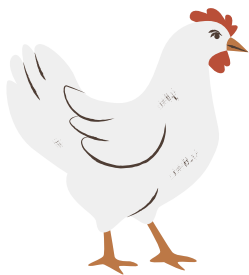

She likes to sit on the floor.

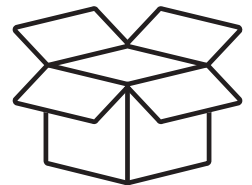


In an Enclosed Space

In a box.

The clothes are in the wardrobe.



At a Point

At tells us that the following noun is located at a specific point or location. It shows an exact position.

She works at a bank.

The children are at school.

VALENTINE'S DAY BALL

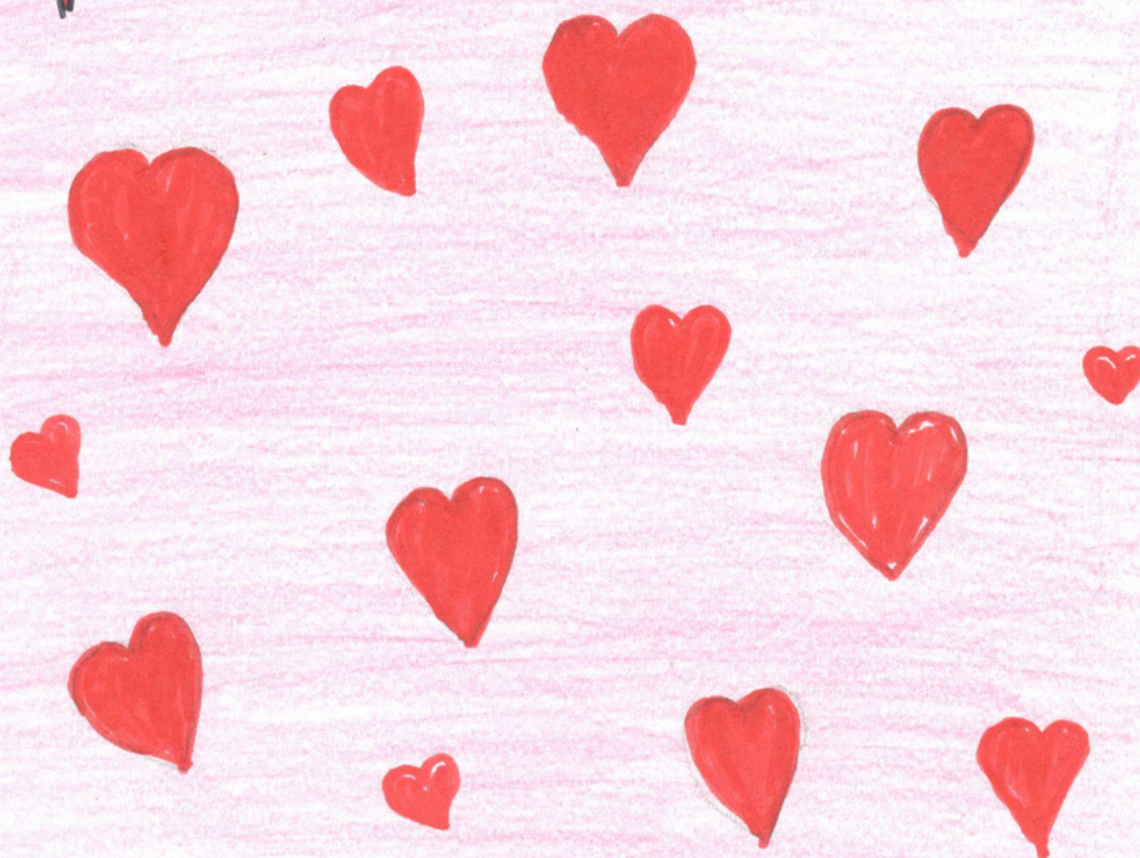
On February 8, a Valentine's ball was held at our school. It was a perfect night full of dancing, singing and fun!

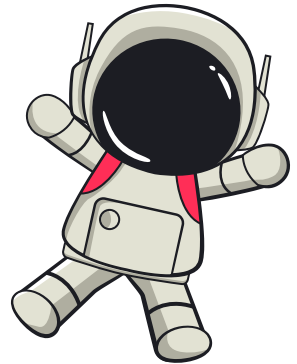
Paramedic
